Types of Services

Counseling/Psychotherapy

Individual, family or group services are available with the primary goal of reducing symptom distress and improving functioning at home, school and in the community.

Mental Health CPST

Individual and group community psychiatric supportive treatment services are available in the home, school and community. Services may include specific mental health interventions designed to reduce symptom distress, coordination and assistance with crisis management, facilitation of the development of daily living skills, individual service plan coordination, advocacy and outreach.

Diagnostic Assessment

Comprehensive psychological evaluation is available for the purpose of assessing presenting mental health concerns with the goal of providing detailed information regarding current social, emotional and cognitive functioning, providing treatment recommendations and specific intervention designed to improve client functioning.

Pharmacotherapy

Psychiatric evaluation and medication consultation services are often provided as an adjunct to other currently provided mental health services to maximize the goal of reducing problematic symptom distress and improving the client's ability to meet daily living expectations.

Home-Based CPST

When medical necessity dictates the need for specific mental health interventions with the child's primary caregiver(s) due to complex family problems which impact the child's presenting mental health symptoms, Home-Based CPST services are available.

Life Skills/Mental Health CPST

This group provides mental health psycho-educational programming for youth ages 15-21. Service delivery includes specific interventions that address presenting mental health symptoms, behaviors and thoughts and assist the client in eliminating barriers for seeking/maintaining education, employment and other self-sufficiency skills necessary for the transition to independence.

Foster Parent Certification & Training

Services are provided to adults interested in becoming Ohio Department of Job and Family Services Certified for placement of children ages birth to young adulthood in Southwest Ohio.

Billing for Services

Services provided can be billed to Medicaid or directly to the family.
